HOW TO REPORT A CRIME ON CAMPUS

Immediately contact the Palo Alto Police at **650-329-2413** or Costa Mesa Police at **714-754-5280**.

Wait for the Officer to answer the phone and; Provide your name, telephone number and location; Give clear and accurate information; Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description, and direction of travel. **DO NOT HANG UP!** Follow the instructions of the Officer.

If you observe any crime or incident, do not leave campus before reporting it.

FOR CRIMES IN PROGRESS OR OTHER EMERGENCIES DIAL "9-1-1"; Provide your name, telephone number and location; Give clear and accurate information; Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description, and direction of travel. **DO NOT HANG UP!** Follow the instructions of the Dispatcher.

CONFIDENTIAL REPORTING

Crimes, suspicious behavior, or situations of concern can always be reported by any person to the Campus Administration at (888) 820-1484 ext 10300 or in case of emergency 911. Persons reporting crimes can remain anonymous if they desire and all anonymous reports relating to criminal activity that appear to have been provided in “good faith” shall be forwarded to the Palo Alto Police Department for evaluation. Occasionally, victims of a crime elect to or are unable to report a crime. However, the University encourages accurate and prompt reporting of all crimes to allow for timely follow up, the issuance of timely warnings, when warranted, and for potential future crime prevention.

Students and employees are encouraged to report any concerns and suspected criminal activity to the Palo Alto or Costa Mesa Police Departments. Victims or bystanders of crimes who do not want to pursue action within the University system or the criminal justice system, may consider making a confidential report. The purpose of a confidential report is to comply with the person’s wish to keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to enhance the future safety of that person. With such information, the University can keep an accurate record of the number of incidents involving students and employees; determine where there is a pattern of crime with regard to a particular location, method, or assailant; and alert the campus to potential danger. Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the annual crime statistics for Sofia University. If a victim or bystander declines to have the details of the crime provided to the Sofia University Campus only the type of crime, location and date occurred will be counted and disclosed in the annual crime statistics for Sofia University.

Counseling and Psychological Services are required by law and professional ethics to protect the confidentiality of all communications with clients. Except in a few circumstances detailed below, Client information and client records cannot be released to anyone outside of Counseling and Psychological Services without the client’s written permission. Legally mandated exceptions to confidentiality include:

- a) Where there is reasonable suspicion of abuse or neglect of children, dependent adults, or elderly persons
- b) Where the client presents a serious danger of violence to another
- c) Where the client is likely to harm him/herself unless protective measures are taken
- d) Where a judge issues a court order to release information

TIMELY WARNINGS

Campus Timely Warning advisory to alert the campus community about any reported crime that represents a serious or continuing threat to the safety of students, faculty and staff will be designed to heighten safety awareness to the campus community and provided in a manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes. The circumstances of any specific situation coupled with the University’s assessment of on-going or continuing threat to the University community, will dictate the need and manner of issuance of a Campus Timely Warning. Timely Warning Notices are typically issued for the following crime classifications: major incidents of arson,

aggravated assault, and murder/non-negligent manslaughter, robbery, and sex offenses.

Timely Warning Notices may also be issued during severe weather or other potential natural hazards. Campus Timely Warning advisories will depend upon the circumstances surrounding the event. Advisories will be distributed in a manner intended to reach the entire campus community.

Campus Timely Warnings will be issued through the University e-mail system and postings on campus bulletin boards and building entrances for students, faculty, and staff.

Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should report the circumstances to the Facilities Coordinator 888-820-1484, extension 10400 (Palo Alto) or extension 11400 (Costa Mesa), and the Campus Administrator 888-820-1484, extension 10300 or in person at the Facilities Coordinator Office or Front Desk in the main lobby.

Preparation of the Annual Security Report

This report is part of an on-going effort to promote safety and security at Sofia University and to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, also known as The Clery Act (<http://clerycenter.org/summary-jeanne-clery-act>). Under this Act, all Colleges and Universities across the country are required to publish this report by October 1 of each year. These reports must contain applicable policies and procedures regarding security and the statistical data from the previous calendar year and the 2 preceding calendar years. At Sofia University, the Annual Security Report is prepared by the Director of the Facilities Management Office in cooperation with key personnel from HR, and information provided by local police agencies.

This Annual Security Report (ASR), which is compiled and published by the Facilities Management Office, defines types of crimes which may occur, suggests safety tips to help ensure one's safety and identifies related safety programs and resources in an effort to promote a safe and secure environment. This report is a collaborative and comprehensive effort that includes the cooperation of departments within the institution, and all employees designated as "Campus Security Authorities" under the Clery Act.

The following are reportable crimes required by The Jeanne Clery Act:

- Criminal Homicide (Murder, Non-negligent Manslaughter, and Negligent Manslaughter)
- Sex Offences (Rape, Fondling, Incest, and Statutory Rape)
- Robbery
- Aggravated Assault
- Burglary
- Motor Vehicle Theft
- Arson
- Arrests and Disciplinary Actions (Liquor Law Violations, Drug Law Violations, and Illegal Weapons Possession)
- Hate Crime(Larceny-theft, Simple Assault, Intimidation, and Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of property)

- Dating Violence, Domestic Violence, and Stalking

All students, part-time, full-time, and intermittent employees receive an annual notice and copy of the ASR in an University-wide email.

CAMPUS ACCESS

Sofia University is a private campus with limited access to the public for special events. During business hours, the University will be open to students, faculty, and staff. After-hour access to the campus is via access card and/or key. All students, faculty, and staff must carry identification at all times when on campus and must present such identification when requested by any University Authority, Campus Safety Officer, and/or Law Enforcement Authority.

All other guests, invitees, and contractors have limited access to most areas. All guests, invitees, and contractors must show identification to any University Authority, Campus Safety Officer, and/or Law Enforcement Authority, upon request. Failure by any individuals to produce identification may result in a request to vacate the premises.

CAMPUS SAFETY

Sofia University is committed to maintaining a safe working environment for students, staff, and faculty.

The University is inspected for health and safety reasons on a regular basis by the Facilities Management Staff. All employees are responsible for immediately reporting unsafe conditions to their supervisor and/or the Director of Facilities Management on the Sofia University Campus. Every effort will be made to remedy problems as quickly as possible.

In the event of an accident involving a personal injury, students, staff, and faculty must notify a supervisor or HR immediately for assistance and reporting purposes. For serious injuries 911 should be called.

CRIME AWARENESS PROGRAMS

Advisements on crime trends and immediate threats are provided to the Sofia University by the Palo Alto and Costa Mesa Police Departments and passed on to the University Community by email postings.

Sofia University does not currently have any Crime Awareness programs in place at this time.

OFF-CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

Sofia University does not currently have off-campus student organizations.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The possession, sale, or the furnishing of alcohol on the University campus is governed California State law. Laws regarding the possession, sale, consumption, or furnishing of alcohol is controlled by the California Department of Alcohol and Beverage Control (ABC). Such laws are strictly enforced by State and Local Authorities. Violators are subject to University disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, fine and imprisonment. It is unlawful to sell, furnish, or provide alcohol to a person under the age of 21. The possession of alcohol by any persons under the age of 21 years in a public place or a place open to the public is illegal. It is also a violation of the Sofia University Alcohol Policy for anyone to consume or possess alcohol in any public or private area of campus without prior Sofia University Administration approval. Organizations or groups in violation of alcoholic beverage policies or laws may be subject to sanction by the Sofia University Administration.

ILLEGAL DRUGS

The Sofia University campus is a “Drug Free” campus. The possession, sale, manufacture, or distribution of any controlled substance is illegal under both Federal and State drug laws. Such laws are strictly enforced by the Sofia University Administration, Federal, State, and Local Law Enforcement Agencies. Violators are subject to Sofia University disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, fine, and imprisonment.

SEXUAL OFFENSES & MISCONDUCT

Sofia University policies on discrimination and sexual misconduct can be found in the Sofia University Handbook.

Under the regulations promulgated under Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972, discrimination prohibited under that Act applies to, among other things, sexual misconduct which also includes sexual harassment. There are many types of sexual misconduct and sexual harassment, all of which constitute unacceptable behavior. For definitions of the type of behavior prohibited as well as grievance procedures and resources for counseling and other services, see the Sofia University Sexual Misconduct Policy. Sofia University prohibits dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

Definitions:

Dating Violence - Controlling, abusive, and aggressive behavior in a romantic relationship. It can happen in straight or gay relationships. It includes verbal, emotional, physical, or sexual abuse, or a combination.

Domestic violence - A pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another intimate partner. Domestic violence can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic, or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes any behaviors that intimidate, manipulate, humiliate, isolate, frighten, terrorize, coerce, threaten, blame, hurt, injure, or wound someone.

Sexual Assault - Sexual offenses are defined as any sexual act against another person, forcibly or against that person's will, or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent. These include forcible rape, forcible sodomy, forcible oral copulation, forcible penetration with an object, and forcible fondling. Sexual offenses also include acts of unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse such as incest and unlawful sex with a minor.

Stalking - Repeated or obsessive unwanted attention directed toward an individual or group that is likely to cause alarm, fear, or substantial emotional distress. Stalking may take many forms, including following, lying in wait, monitoring, and pursuing contact. Stalking may occur in person or through a medium of communication, such as letters, e-mail, text messages, or telephone calls. In some circumstances, two instances of such behavior may be sufficient to constitute stalking.

Sexual Consent - Sexual activity requires consent, which is defined as positive, unambiguous, and voluntary agreement to engage in specific sexual activity throughout a sexual encounter.

Consent cannot be inferred from the absence of a “no”; a clear “yes,” verbal or otherwise, is

necessary. Consent to some sexual acts does not constitute consent to others, nor does past consent to a given act constitute present or future consent. Consent must be ongoing throughout a sexual encounter and can be revoked at any time. Consent cannot be obtained by threat, coercion, or force. Agreement under such circumstances does not constitute consent.

REPORTING SEX OFFENSES AND SEXUAL MISCONDUCT Students, who are victims or bystanders of a sexual offense, are encouraged to report/notify the Sofia University Campus Safety Officer, the Dean of Student Services, or Sofia Administrative staff. Students also have the option and are encouraged to notify the Palo Alto Police Department and the option to be assisted by campus authorities in notifying these authorities.

Students who have been raped or sexually assaulted should try to preserve all physical evidence. They should not wash, use the toilet, or change clothing, if doing so can be avoided. If oral contact took place, one should not smoke, eat, drink, or brush one’s teeth. If one changes clothes, all clothing worn at the time of the attack should be placed in a paper bag, not plastic. Medical attention should be sought as soon as possible to assess any physical injuries, prevent sexually transmitted diseases or pregnancy, and collect important evidence in the event legal action is taken.

By federal law, incidents of sexual assault that are known to any member of the staff or faculty of Sofia University must be reported to the Director of Facilities Management. This report is for statistical purposes and contains only the nature of the incident and the location. No names are involved, unless the victim chooses to make such a report.

Students who are victims of a sexual offense are further encouraged to seek appropriate medical attention and to get help and support such as counseling.

CONFIDENTIALITY, PRIVACY, AND REPORTING

Sofia University officials have varying reporting responsibilities and abilities to maintain confidentiality. In order to make informed choices, one should be aware of confidentiality and mandatory reporting requirements when consulting campus resources. On campus, some resources may maintain confidentiality, offering options and advice without any obligation to inform outside agency or individual unless you have requested that information be shared. Other resources exist for you to report crimes and Policy violations and these resources will take action when victimization is reported to them.

Making a report means telling someone in authority what happened. At the time a report is made, the alleged victim does not have to decide whether or not to pursue a particular course of action. Choosing to make a report and deciding how to proceed can be a process that unfolds over time. The University provides support that can assist each individual in making these important decisions and to the extent legally possible will respect the individual's autonomy in deciding how to proceed. **If you are unsure of someone's duty and ability to maintain privacy, ask them before talking to them.** They will be able to explain and help a reporting party make decisions about who is in the best position to help.

University Disciplinary Procedures

Allegations of sexual offenses by students will be adjudicated through the procedures outlined in Sofia University Code of Student Conduct section of the policy manual. Violators are subject to sanctions outlined in the policy manual, up to and including suspension and expulsion from the University.

SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION

The Office of The Attorney General for the State of California maintains a website with the California State Sex Offender Registry. This registry is available at www.meganslaw.ca.gov. Registered sex offenders who are employed, carry on a vocation, or are students at Sofia University are required under the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2000, as amended, to notify the University that they are registered sex offenders. In the State of California, convicted sex offenders are required to register with the police department of the city in which he/she lives.

POLICY ON FIREARMS, WEAPONS, AND EXPLOSIVES

It is Sofia University policy and California Law that any and all firearms are strictly prohibited on University property. Also prohibited is any ammunition in the presence of a firearm or without the presence of a firearm. Under California Penal Code, section 626.9, any person who brings or possesses a firearm upon the grounds of, or within 1000 feet, of any public or private school is guilty of a felony which is punishable by imprisonment. The only persons excepted from the policy are city, state, and federal peace officers and licensed armored vehicle guards.

In addition, Sofia University policy prohibits any and all types of destructive/explosives devices of all classes (see California Health and Safety Code sections 12000-12007) on University property. "Explosives" includes, but is not limited to, any explosives as defined in Section 841 of Title 18 of the United States Code. "Destructive device" means, but not limited to, any projectile containing any explosive or incendiary material or any chemical substance, bomb, facsimile bomb, grenade, explosive missile or similar device or any launching device. "Explosive devices" means, but is not limited to, any substance, or combination of substances, the primary common purpose of which is detonation or rapid combustion. Prohibited materials include, but are not limited to: dynamite, nitroglycerin, black powder, propellant explosives, detonation primers, blasting caps, commercial boosters, snappers, poppers, firecrackers and fireworks. Violations of this policy are punishable by fines and/or imprisonment.

It is also a violation of Sofia University policy and California Law for any person, except as defined under California Penal Code section 626.10, to bring or possess any dirk, dagger, ice pick, or knife having a fixed blade longer than two and one half (2-1/2) inches on any University property. In addition, no person shall display, fire, discharge, shoot or operate, or assist or participate in the displaying, firing, discharging, shooting, or operating of any air gun, gas-operated gun, spring gun, sling, slingshot, bow and arrow, paint pellet gun, laser gun, or other device designed or intended to discharge, or capable of discharging any missile or light ray on University property (see California Penal Code sections 244-245). Violations of this policy are punishable by fines and/or imprisonment.

Violation of Federal Law, California Law, and Sofia University policy on firearms, weapons, and explosives are adjudicated by city, state, and federal authority. Any violation that might be deemed an infraction of the University policy will be adjudicated through the University President's Appointees following the procedures outlined in the Sofia University Code of Student Conduct. Violations are subject to sanctions outlined in the Student Conduct Code, up to and including suspension and expulsion from the University.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND EVACUATION PROCEDURES

Upon confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous condition involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees occurring on or near the campus, the Sofia University will initiate procedures to implement all or portions of the Timely Warning process. Confirmation of the threat is made by a dispatched Campus Safety Officer or by information received from local police/fire authorities. This information is in turn given to the Director of

Facilities Management. If it is determined that notifications are to be made, the Director, Campus Safety Site Supervisor, or their designee shall initiate the notification of the entire Campus Community.

The content of the notification will be dependent on the nature of the event or threat, and be decided by the Director, Campus Safety Site Supervisor, or designee. Considerations on certain events will be under advisements and recommendations of local law and/or fire authority.

Campus Timely Warning will be issued through the college e-mail system and postings on campus bulletin boards and building entrances to warn students, faculty, and staff of the advisory.

Emergency Plan and Capability Testing

Sofia University conducts a minimum of one test per year, designed for assessment and evaluation of emergency plans and capabilities. While these tests may be announced or unannounced, they will:

- Be scheduled
- Contain drills
- Contain exercises
- Contain follow-through activities
- Be designed for assessment of emergency plans and capabilities
- Be designed for evaluation of emergency plans and capabilities

The University publicizes its emergency response and evacuation procedures in conjunction with at least one test per calendar year. It will also maintain documentation of each test conducted for a minimum of seven years. This documentation includes:

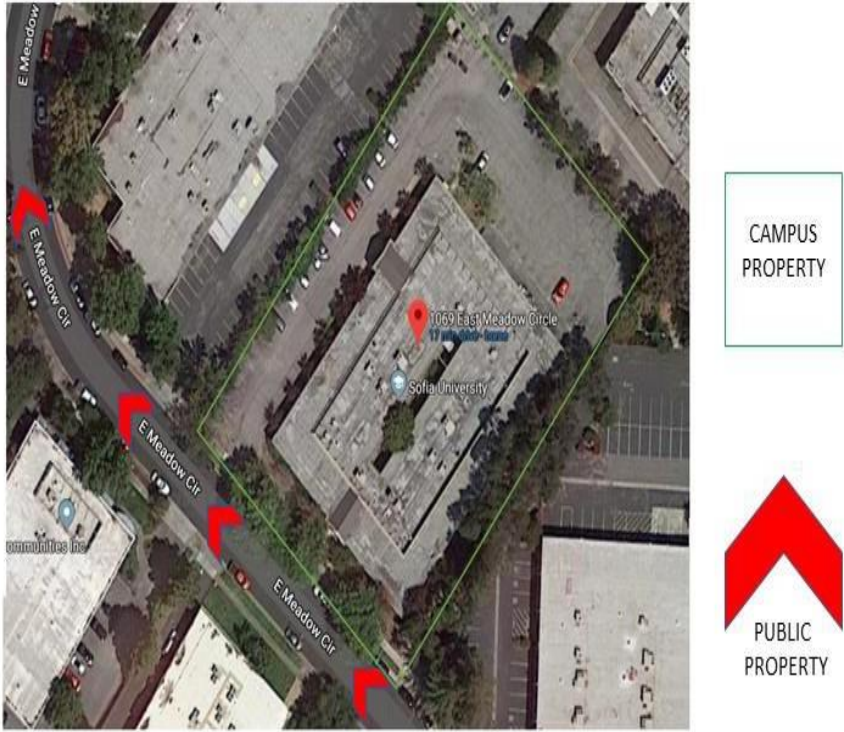
- A description of the test / exercise
- The date the test was held
- The time the test started and ended
- Whether the test was announced or unannounced

Building Evacuation Procedures

At the end of each academic year, faculty, staff, and students will receive an email with information and links of the evacuation procedures and other emergency response information.

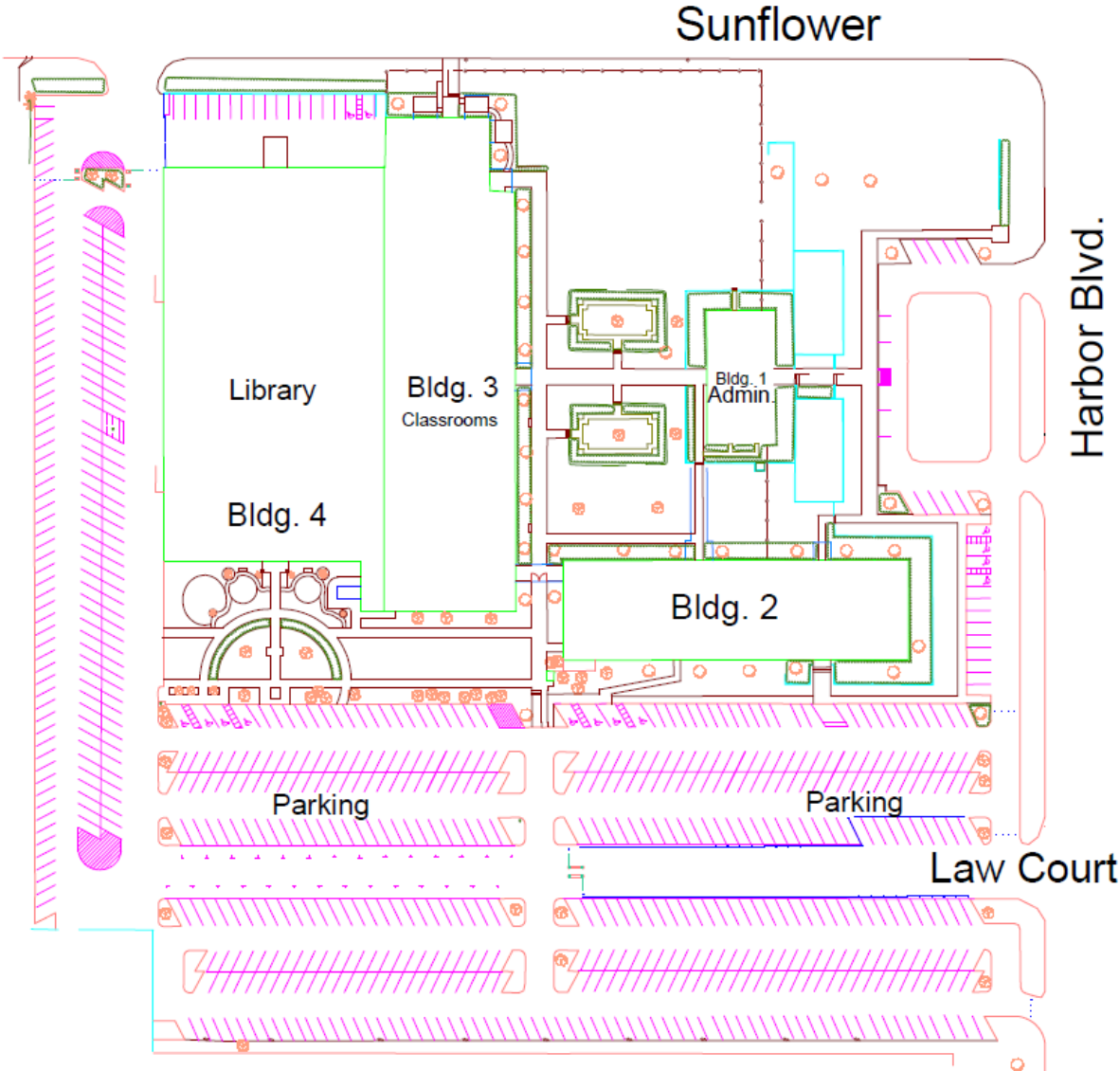
